The CGCA Fellowship Program provides **emerging and mid-career** artists unrestricted access to the facilities and materials necessary for blown, sculpted, cast and kiln formed glass.

THE STUDIO

The WheatonArts Glass Studio is a dramatic 3000 sq. ft. building modeled on the original T. C. Wheaton Factory, and is designed to accommodate a wide variety of glassworking techniques. An inventory and spec list of all equipment is available on our website www.creativeglasscenter.com or can be mailed upon request. In addition to hosting the CGCA Fellows, a dynamic studio staff, led by Hank Murta Adams, demonstrates and interprets glassmaking for visitors, facilitates production initiatives, and participates in public education programs and special events. Our Glass Studio community functions as a family, creating and protecting an environment conducive to the creative process for all studio users.

The Creative Glass Center of America, CGCA, was founded in 1983 by a group of artists, educators and gallery directors who became sensitive to the particular needs and financial burdens facing artists who work with glass. Housed and administered by Wheaton Arts and Cultural Center for the past 25 years, the CGCA has awarded 312 fellowships to artists from around the world.

Wheaton Arts and Cultural Center

CGCA is housed at WheatonArts, in Millville, NJ, an East Coast arts center dedicated to a mission "to engage artists and audiences in an evolving exploration of creativity." Founded by the late Frank H. Wheaton Jr., and opened in 1970, Wheaton Arts and Cultural Center has evolved to be one of New Jersey's most important cultural resources. Programs include museum and gallery exhibits; artist residencies; interpretive demonstrations in various mediums; student outreach programs; Folklife presentations and exhibits; collector's seminars, and hands-on educational opportunities for children and adults. The founder's original focus on the history of American glass is exemplified in the comprehensive and prestigious collection of the Museum of American Glass. The T. C. Wheaton Glass Factory is one of the nation's first amphitheater style hot glass studios. Other studios with year round resident ceramicists, flameworkers, and woodcarvers offer daily public programs during peak season. Additionally, the Down Jersey Folklife Center offers educational exhibitions and program reflecting South Jersey's rich cultural heritage.

WheatonArts is located in an area rich in glassmaking history. It is within driving distance to New York, Philadelphia and Washington, D.C.

THE SELECTION PROCESS

The CGCA is committed to the practice of an artist peer review process when selecting fellowship recipients. The selection committee of professional artists will meet in November and 2010 Fellows will be announced in December. Past jurors include Anna Booth, Deborah Czeresko, Karen LaMonte, Judith Schaechter and Walter Zimmerman.

The application requirements and instructions are listed separately. Please follow instructions; incomplete applications are not eligible for selection.

FELLOWSHIPS

We are proud to offer 10 Fellowships for 2010. Fellowships will be awarded for either a three month or six-week session. The shorter sessions provide an idea; opportunity for artists with young families, artists whose professional commitments do not afford them the option of a three-month residency and for teams of artist wishing to collaborate on a particular project. Six-week Fellowship applicants should contact the CGCA to discuss the possibility of accommodating assistants or alternative situations. Please note that assistants can not be granted person studio access. Artists who have received CGCA Fellowships must wait three years after the completion of their fellowship before reapplying to the program.

Fellows are expected to be proficient in the processes and techniques represented in their application goals. As community members, Fellows and staff support one another in the stewardship of the studio and often assist one another in blowing, casting, and other processes. All work from design through annealing and coldworking is the responsibility of the Fellow.

Regardless of duration, each Fellow is provided with rent-free housing, a monthly stipend and 24-hour access to the facilities. Fellows share the CGCA House with the Assistants, each having a private room and sharing common living areas. Fellows are asked to donate one piece, created during their residency, for inclusion in the permanent collection of the Museum of American Glass, located at Wheaton Arts and Cultural Center. Fellows are also required to work in view of the public for 12 hours per week, to host one open studio evening event with their co-Fellows, and may be asked to participate in selected community outreach programs.

Applicants must submit all of the following items as specified by the postmarked deadline of **October 26, 2009**. Materials will become the property of WheatonArts and will not be returned. If the applicant is chosen for the Fellowship, his/her images will be used for publication. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Applicants applying for a collaborative project must follow all application procedures as individuals. Both should note in their applications with whom they are applying and the nature of the collaboration. This does not apply to six-week applicants with intent to bring an assistant.

Specifications for images

Resolution of 300 dpi, saved in a JPEG file format

6 inches in the largest dimension

Title/save each image with applicant last name and number of work to indicate order (i.e. Smith01, Smith02, etc...)

Image No. 1 should represent the work you feel is of the best quality

Image No. 10 should represent what you would pursue as a CGCA Fellow

DO NOT format the images into a presentation!

DO NOT submit more than 10 images!

- Title of piece
- Description/technique
- Dimensions and Date of completion

3. * One paragraph biography

4. * Statement of Intent

Explain how you would use the Fellowship period to benefit your artistic and career development. Indicate the primary technique you will employ during the Fellowship period.

5. * Current Resume/C.V.

* Specifications for ALL documents

Submit all documents on the CD Rom with the images

Acceptable forms include: Microsoft Word up to version 2006 or PDF

Documents must be saved with applicant last name and short description of item
