

WHEATONARTS TO HOST RENAISSANCE-THEMED FANTASY FAIRE ON JUNE 25 & 26

MILLVILLE, NJ (June 6, 2016) – Wheaton Arts and Cultural Center is pleased to announce that Fantasy Faire will be held on Saturday, June 25th and Sunday, June 26th from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. each day. In partnership with Mystic Realms, Inc. ®, this annual event features traditional theatric skills with live-action role-playing that creates an interactive experience. Strolling costumed characters, portraying historical and mythical figures, interact with each other and WheatonArts visitors throughout the campus during both days of Fantasy Faire.

Role-playing has been referred to by many as a form of performing arts, with some elements of improvisational theater present. Performing arts, often defined as art forms of creative activity performed in front of an audience, such as drama, music, and dance, is another form of expression that intersects with the WheatonArts mission to *engage artists and audiences in an evolving exploration of creativity*. At Fantasy Faire, historic fact from the Medieval and Renaissance periods is blended with mythology and contemporary popular fantasy. Visitors should expect to watch and engage with a variety of family-friendly characters. From kings to elves and gypsy dancers to famous characters like Robin Hood, the whole family will be immersed in an interactive day of performing arts.

Highlights include:

- The Kingdom of Wheaton's Grand Tournament of Prosperity in which the Baron's champions fight for glory and honor
- Story Book Grove, where characters like Cinderella, Prince Charming, Beauty and the Beast, and the Pied Piper share stories and delight audiences
- Renaissance and folk music performances, including the musical stylings of the "The Misplaced Pub" band
- The raising of the Spring Pole and Wrapping Dance
- Demonstrations of medieval combat by Phoenix Swords and Mystic Mercenaries of Philadelphia, Renaissance dancing, textile production, arms and armor, archery, and other Renaissance-related activities
- At the Court of Miracles, children can meet Esmeralda and other characters from the Hunchback of Notre Dame and watch dancing and drumming demonstrations
- Grymm Witches family-friendly and funny storytelling

Vendors will offer a variety of unique products including jewelry, medieval and fantasy costumes, leather goods, and psychic readings. Also the gaming area, centered around a pirate theme, features games such as a beanbag toss for kids and ax/knife throwing for adults. Food and refreshments will be available for purchase. Visitors receive a detailed program of activities each day.

The Fantasy Faire is included in the price of admission to WheatonArts. Ticket prices are: adults \$10.00, senior adults \$9.00 and students \$7.00 and children five and under are free.
